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Dear friends of the Center,

In church jargon, we use the word "encounter" to mean an experience of Christ or God. What does such encounter look like in reality?

As a youth, I frequently hiked the White Mountains of New Hampshire. Sitting atop rocky summits and appreciating the scenic vistas below me, I inevitably experienced a deep abiding sense of peace, love, and joy. As a young adult, I experienced this same spiritual presence while watching sunsets on the north shore of Oahu and the beaches of Lake Michigan. It wasn't until much later that I understood

these experiences as deep and intimate personal encounters with God.

To this day, I continue to experience similar encounters of God through nature. I also encounter Christ in other forms of silence and solitude. I often encounter God during Mass. Yet sometimes I'm not fully present, and the spiritual experience falls flat. I most frequently encounter God in prayer while walking my dog each morning. But I don't have the same degree of encounter during our evening walks as I wrestle with the day's details. I experience rich encounters with God as I meditate on daily scriptures and discuss them with Christ. Yet, no encounter seems to occur on days when I hastily read the gospel running out the door late for work.

How do I distinguish between what is true encounter and what is not? Sometimes it's a feeling. Other times there is no feeling, yet I am vaguely aware of having encountered God. For me, the distinguishing mark of genuine encounter with God is *love*. This characteristic *mark of love* involves two elements. The first involves my personal awareness that I am loved. Even amidst sadness, pain, and suffering, I have often been able to experience God's love. Sometimes that love comes through other people like my wife.

The second element involves how I am inspired to respond with loving action. After all, love begets love. When I am open and receive God's love, I am empowered to love others more genuinely and concretely. My thoughts, words and deeds show how I have chosen to love God, his creation, and his creatures. This loving choice includes my conversations and behaviors with family, friends, members of the various tribes to which I belong, and total strangers.

What does an encounter with God actually look like? The ways are infinite and varied. However, evidence of true encounter is found in how we receive and respond to Christ's love, in what we say and how we say it, and by how we collaborate in fostering God's kingdom on earth.

Thank you for your prayerful support and financial partnership in the Center's mission to reach out with the love of God – our Holy and Triune God who wants everyone to encounter him. May you encounter Christ daily and may that encounter inspire you to share your love with the world around you.
