Dear friends of the Center,

Happy Advent! During this season, the Church invites us to prepare in expectation for the coming of Christ's Kingdom in its fullness. It is also a time to look back and reflect upon God's gracious actions in our lives over the last year.

Here at the Catholic Information Center, we are grateful for 75 years of Paulist ministry in west Michigan and our mission to help people learn, celebrate, live, and pray the Catholic Faith. In 2022, we hosted 59 classes and programs with close to 1.200 total enrollments.

Because our programs are offered online through Zoom as well as in person, attendees were from Toronto, New York, Columbus, Austin, Los Angeles, and places in between.

For example, Lynn Mills of St. Ann's Parish in Baldwin was able to participate from home in our Leadership Formation Institute for Biblical Studies this past summer. Through the Institute, she was able to meet and learn from various Scripture scholars from around the country and deepen her understanding of the Bible. Lynne writes, "Thank you for your class and for helping me grow my courage to start a Bible study." This fall, Lynne started a new Bible study in her parish with 12 participants.

Our Gallagher Talk this year addressed an issue we all face - toxic polarization. Exploring how blindness, fear, and anger contribute to a climate of toxic polarization, Paulist Father Steven Bell offered faith remedies, addressing ways that we can bring hope and healing to a weary and divided world. Because of our continued effort to offer programming simultaneously in-person and online, we extended our reach to 228 people online, in addition to the 100 plus attending in-person here in Grand Rapids.

We are grateful to God who has entrusted us with his mission to give the Good News of Jesus a voice in today's world. The joy and anticipation of Christ in Advent gives us much hope going forward to help people embrace the Catholic faith here and beyond the walls of the Center.
