As we find ourselves amid the Advent season, the Catholic Information Center is committed to bringing light to a world that often seems overshadowed by darkness. Our programs this month embody the essence of this mission.

The 55Plus program, "Christmas Traditions Around the World" aims to foster cultural understanding and unity during this season of hope. We invite you to join us on Tuesday, Dec. 5, 10-11:30 a.m., for an interactive tour at the Meijer Gardens where we will explore traditions celebrating the birth of Jesus and share your own family traditions.

On Thursday, Dec. 7, 6:30-8:30 p.m. ET, we present "An Evening in December: Behold!" The word "behold" is not just an invitation to look, but an affirmation that the divine is at work. This ecumenical event, sponsored by several local faith communities, reminds us that the good news and great joy of Christ's coming are meant for all - bringing hope, peace, and love to the world.

Finally, on Tuesday, Dec. 12, 7-8:30 p.m. ET, we offer "Following Jesus in a Warming World." Rev. Kyle Meyaard-Schaap will provide insights and advice to address the climate crisis, offering hope to those who seek to turn concern into action.

These events highlight the kind of programming that we have offered over the past year. To date, we have hosted 44 programs, including our leadership institutes, with more than 1,500 enrolled from 31 states and 6 countries. And because our programs are recorded, past presentations are available on our YouTube channel, so that our message can reach people far and wide.

It is your partnership that empowers us to continue this mission of spreading peace and hope in a world desperately in need.
